## Investing in a better future

As Australia emerges from the global economic crisis, the combined efforts of government, business and employees are required to face the challenges ahead.

In early 2009 the NSW Government held a NSW Jobs Summit to identify ways to protect jobs during the global economic downturn, and to ensure the State's workforce has the skills to support jobs growth in new and emerging industries. In response to requests at the NSW Jobs Summit, the NSW Government hosted Regional Jobs Summits in the Hunter and the Illawarra. Following these summits, the Premier announced significant funding packages to support jobs in the [Illawarra](#) and the [Hunter](#) regions.

Country NSW faces many challenges but also has many unique strengths and opportunities. The NSW Government will be holding a series of Country Jobs Summits over the coming months, the first of which is specifically tailored for the Central West and Western NSW regions. This summit will be held on 27 November 2009 in Bathurst.

Due to a rapidly growing population, Western Sydney also faces many economic challenges. A Western Sydney Jobs Summit, to identify ideas to create jobs and generate investment in Western Sydney, will be held in Penrith on Friday 4 December 2009.
